

The University commenced its first B.A. LL.B.(Hons.) batch in 2019 and has started LL.M. and Ph.D. courses in 2024. ABOUT THE LL.M. PROGRAMME

The University offers an LL.M., a two-year degree programme as per UGC guidelines, to the eligible students who are interested in pursuing a post-graduate degree in law. The main objective of this programme is to groom the students to acquire in-depth and exhaustive theoretical and practical knowledge that enables them to hit the target in their respective specialised fields and thereby continue towards their objective of attaining excellence. The extensive programme provides enough flexibility in respect of lecture courses, seminars and research dissertations, which are aimed at doing research and developing the requisite writing expression in their fields of research. DBRANLU shall be offering the Post-Graduate Course in Law through the Choice-Based Credit System (CBCS).

The CBCS provides an opportunity for the students to choose courses from the prescribed list, comprising core, elective/minor, or skill-based courses. The courses can be evaluated following the grading system, which is considered to be better than the conventional marking system. The grading system provides uniformity in the valuation and computation of the Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) based on the student's performance in examinations, which enables the student to move across institutions of higher learning. The uniformity of the evaluation system also enables potential employers to assess the performance of the candidates.

The LL.M. programme is a specialised post-graduate degree in which students will be offered various specialised streams, like Criminal law and Corporate law. It will follow the semester system consisting of a total of four semesters wherein a couple of courses on important subject matters, like comparative constitutional law, law and justice in a globalised world, alternate dispute resolution mechanisms, research methodology, and legal pedagogy, will be offered. For further details, kindly refer to the scheme of study laid down herein below. This course is designed to keep in view the balanced requirements of society as well as the teaching profession with pragmatic professionalism and research-based teaching-learning inputs. The teaching methodology under this programme will be holistic, which includes extensive and intensive classroom teaching with an emphasis on participative practical learning. It will include assignments, symposiums, seminars, field visits, and project work.

ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

The minimum eligibility for seeking admission is as follows:

i.A five-year integrated law degree or a three-year law degree, or an equivalent examination degree with a minimum of fifty percent (50%) marks or its equivalent grade in the case of candidates belonging to General/OBC/PWD categories and forty-five percent (45%) marks or its equivalent grade in the case of candidates belonging to SC/ST categories.

ii. The admission shall be based exclusively on the performance of the candidate in the Common Law Admission Test (CLAT).

i.Candidates appearing in their final semester examination of the qualifying examination or awaiting results of the qualifying examination are also eligible to apply. Such candidates who are appearing in the undergraduate course will be provisionally admitted, subject to the submission of a pass result fulfilling the conditions for the undergraduate qualifying degree, at the time of counselling or any other date as specified by the university.

DURATION OF THE PROGRAMME

The duration of the programme shall be two years consisting of four semesters.

- Each academic year shall be divided into two terms: Odd semester & Even semester.
- The maximum period to complete LL.M. Two Years Degree Program is four years, provided the
 extension is granted by the Vice-Chancellor (if it deems fit) and Extension fee as may be
 prescribed by the University, is paid.

EXAMINATIONS AND EVALUATION

The University shall hold examinations for awarding LL.M. Two Years Degree according to the following scheme:

AWARD OF THE DEGREE

A student shall be eligible for the award of the LL.M. (Two Years) Degree after he/she has successfully completed all the prescribed courses in all the semesters and secured requisite Credits with 50% marks in each paper (50% in Mid-term and 50% in End term separately) and 50% aggregate.

WITHDRAWAL OF THE DEGREE

A degree awarded by the university may be withdrawn if it is found at a later stage that the candidate has submitted any forged document or is ineligible at the time of admission to the course or any other act in violation of Section 34 of the University Act.

SCHOLARSHIPS, AWARDS AND MEDALS

- A candidate with the highest CGPA would be declared the Topper, provided he/she has qualified all the course papers examination in the first attempt.
- In the case of a tie for CGPA, the student who is the senior in age will be the topper.
- A Gold, Silver and Bronze medal will be awarded on the basis of securing the first three highest CGPAs in the course concerned.

RESIDENTIAL HOSTELS

Dr. B. R. Ambedkar National Law University started its first academic session in July 2019. Five batches of B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) have been admitted, and the university is functioning from its main campus. Hostels are constructed on the latest modern pattern. These are equipped with all the facilities, including neat and clean mess/dining facilities. Hostels have eight floors that are accessible through lifts and stairs. The needs of especially abled people are also kept in consideration, and hostels are comfortable and accommodating for them. Hostels are also equipped with water purifier systems attached to water coolers to ensure a pure, drinkable water supply, 24-hour power backup. Proper hygiene and sanitation are maintained by the housekeeping service. The hostels have round-the- clock security, and all the hostels are equipped with Wi-Fi connections. There are recreational facilities for the hostelers, like table-tennis, board games, televisions, carrom boards, etc.

LIBRARY

Our university provides a well-designed, spacious, separate library premise with air-conditioned reading halls with adequate seating capacity. The DBRANLU Knowledge Resource Centre is an example of excellence regarding amenities and collection. This is a fully computerized Wi-Fi Knowledge Resource Centre. DBRANLU Knowledge Resource Centre has subscribed to many E-resources including Manupatra, Westlaw, JSTOR Full package, Lexis-Nexis, EBC Reader, and Live Law, which are also available in print forms. DBRANLU Law Review is an online peer-reviewed and biannual journal of DBRANLU. The journal is dedicated to



SIGNATURE OF THE CANDIDATE

ANTI RAGGING REGULATIONS

The University highly condemns the act of Ragging and take strict measures against those who are found guilty for the same.

What Constitutes Ragging? Ragging constitutes one or more of any of the following acts:

- a) Any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student.
- b) Indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student.
- c) Asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student.
- d) Any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher.
- e) Exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students.
- f) Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students.
- g) Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person;
- h) Any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, post, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student.
- i) Any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher.
- j) Any other act/omission as per UGC Regulations 2009 and amended time to time

Punishment Provisions:

Any student or group of students found guilty of ragging, whether on campus or off campus, shall be subject to one or more of the following punishments:

- 1. Debarring from appearing in any sessional test or university examination, or withholding of results.
- 2. Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
- 3. Withdrawing scholarships and other benefits.
- 4. Suspension from the college for a period of one month.
- 5. Cancellation of admission.
- 6. Debarring from representing the institution in any national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
- 7. Suspension or expulsion from the hostel.
- 8. Rustication from the institution for periods varying from 1 to 4 semesters or equivalent period.
- 9. Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution.
- 10. Fine up to twenty-five thousand rupees.
- 11. Imprisonment for a term which may extend to two years, or with a fine which may extend to ten thousand rupees, or with both.
- 12. Collective punishment: When the students committing or abetting the crime of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment as a deterrent to ensure community pressure on the potential raggers. Any institution that fails to take adequate steps to prevent ragging, or fails to act in accordance with the regulations, or fails to punish perpetrators or incidents of ragging suitably, is liable to the penalties and punishments as per the provisions of the regulations.

NOTE-: All the Students shall submit an Anti-Ragging Affidavit available on the U.G.C. Website Cross-
